

Radio Broadcast: How Do You Move 100+ Monet Masterpieces? Very, Very Carefully






Mary Cassatt: Extraordinary Impressionist Painter By Barbara Herkert

This picture book follows young Linnea as she finds inspiration in Claude Monet's garden. This title introduces readers to Impressionism and Monet's life work.




Picture This!: Activities and Adventures in Impressionism By Joyce Raimondo

Young readers will learn more about Impressionism and be encouraged to create their own art using Impressionist techniques.




Katie Meets the Impressionists By James Mayhew

What Makes a Degas a Degas? By Richard Muhlberger



Chicago Bound: A Jake McGreevey Novel By James Mayhew


This middle-grade book follows Jake and his friends as they try to solve the mystery of a real-life art heist.
