


Lily's Mountain By Hannah Moderow


Who Pooped in the Park? By Gary Robson

The Who Pooped in the Park? series includes books for many different National Parks. In each, readers can learn about scat identification through the adventures of young park visitors.




My Yosemite By Mike Graf

This guidebook includes tips and advice for exploring national parks, as well as stories from frequent visitors to Yosemite National Park.




National Parks of the U.S.A. By Kate Siber


The Wild World of Buck Bray series follows an 11-year-old reality star and his TV crew as they solve mysteries in different National Parks.



Secrets of the Sequoias By Mike Graf


The fictional middle-grade series
