<u>Audio Clip: Joe DiMaggio Tells His Story</u>

In this audio clip, listeners can hear Joe DiMaggio tell the story of his 1941 streak and how it ended in his own words. DiMaggio tells how his streak caught the attention of baseball viewers and shares how the pressure built as the games added up.

Primary Source Article: 1950 New York Herald Tribune

In this 1950 article by American sportswriter Red Smith, Joe DiMaggio shares his recollections of the 1941 season and the ways in which his team rallied around his success. He also shares how he listened to the World Series on the radio during his childhood and fell in love with the game.




